Protection of personal data

INFORMATION (Articles 13 and 14 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679)

This section provides details on the processing of personal data of users who access the European Platform for Judicial Auctions, managed by the LEILA Consortium via the Ministry of Justice, located at Via Arenula n. 70, 00186 Rome, Italy. The Ministry of Justice acts as the Data Controller.

This policy herein pertains solely to the interactions on the European Platform for Judicial Auctions accessible via <https://pilot.ejudicialauctions.eu/>.

It does not extend to any external websites or services linked through the platform.

General principles of treatment

The data processing carried out is based on the principles of correctness, lawfulness, transparency and protection of personal data and the rights of interested parties. Therefore, the Data Controller implements adequate technical and organizational measures to guarantee, and be able to demonstrate, that the processing of the data provided is carried out in compliance with the GDPR, taking into account the nature, scope of



application, context and purposes of the processing, as well as risks for the rights and freedoms of natural persons connected to the processing of data and having different probabilities and severity. In compliance with the principle of accountability, as set out in the art. 5 paragraph 2 of the GDPR, this document is subjected to periodic review, to ensure full adherence and conformity to the procedures and practices followed by the Data Controller.

For the purposes of the application and interpretation of the present policy, the terms and phrases used have the following meaning:

- 'LEILA – towards a multilingual European platform for judicial Auctions' Project (the LEILA Project) is a project funded by the European Union's Justice Programme (2014-2020) under Call JUST-JACC-EJU-AG-2020 and implemented under Grant Agreement No. 101007385 within the 01/02/2021 – 30/11/2023 (34 months) period.
- 'LEILA Consortium' is the LEILA Project Consortium, formed by the following beneficiaries (partners) acting jointly as a consortium under Grant Agreement No. 101007385: Ministry of Justice (Italy), acting in their capacity of a project coordinator and official representative of the

The Ministry of Justice (Italy) is the department in power about the formulation of judicial policies in Italy and is headquartered in Rome, Italy, with seat and address of management: Via Arenula, 70, Rome, Italy.

Legal basis and purpose of processing

The European Platform for Judicial Auctions is a multilingual platform aiming:

(a) to deliver information on judicial auctions taking place in European Member States which national information systems are integrated with the Platform;



(b) to provide a solution for European Member States without a government-managed platform for judicial auctions willing to make national judicial auction information available online.

The European Platform for Judicial Auctions is developed, managed, and administered by the LEILA Consortium through the Ministry of Justice (Italy) and is accessible via <https://pilot.ejudicialauctions.eu/>.

Type of data processed

The European Platform for Judicial Auctions allows its users to perform federated one-stop searches over all participating Member States, for available items for sale (immovable items, movable items, and rights) through judicial (public) auctions, be they electronic, in-person or hybrid, retrieving the information in a uniform and seamless fashion, with an option for comparative presentation.

No data related to the articles 9 and 10 of EU Regulation no. 2016/679 are processed.

Treatment methods

Since no personal data are processed, there are no treatment methods.



Browsing data

The computer systems and software procedures used to operate this site acquire, during their normal operation, some personal data whose transmission is implicit in the use of Internet communication protocols.

This category of data includes the IP addresses or domain names of the computers and terminals used by users, the addresses in URI/URL (Uniform Resource Identifier /Locator) notation of the requested resources, the time of the request, etc. These data, necessary for the use of web services, are not used, let alone processed.

Rights of interested parties

Interested parties have the right to obtain from the Ministry of Justice, in the cases provided for, access to their personal data and the rectification or cancellation of the same or the limitation of the processing that concerns them or to oppose the processing (articles 15 et seq. of EU Regulation no. 679 of 2016). Browsing data retention period

The data will be processed for the duration of navigation in accordance with the principle of necessity with respect to the purpose of the processing.

Browsing data are not kept for more than thirty days (except for any need to ascertain crimes by the judicial authority) (Art.13, paragraph 2, letter a) GDPR).



Cookies

In compliance with the provisions of the Guarantor's provision of 10 June 2021 "Guidelines for cookies and other tracking tools" (Published in the Official Gazette no. 163 of 9 July 2021) we inform you that this site does use technical cookies.

Cookies are small text files that the site, while browsing, sends to the user's terminal, where they are stored, and then re-transmitted to the same site on the next visit.

This Cookie Policy aims to illustrate the types of cookies used by this site, the purposes and methods of use of the same, as well as to provide information relating to the methods with which the user can deny (even in a second moment) consent and/or modify, at any time and easily, the options relating to the use of cookies by the Site.

Cookies are not harmful to the device you use. Through the cookies that this site generates, no personal identifying information is stored, but encrypted information is used to improve the user's experience on the site and to identify and resolve errors.

Technical cookies

Technical cookies are used for the sole purpose of "*transmitting a communication over an electronic communications network, or to the extent strictly necessary for the provider of an information society service explicitly requested by the contractor or user to provide this service*" (see art. 122, paragraph 1, of the Privacy Code). They are not used for other purposes and are normally installed directly by the owner or manager of the website.

Among technical cookies, the Guarantor for the protection of personal data (see General Provision "Identification of simplified methods for the information and



acquisition of consent for the use of cookies - 8 May 2014") also includes the following types:

Analytics cookies

Browsing or session cookies

They record data useful for normal navigation and use of the site on the user's computer (allowing, for example, to remember the preferred language used). These cookies can then be distinguished based on their persistence on the user's computer: those that are automatically deleted at the end of each navigation are called session cookies. If, on the other hand, they have a longer life, they are called permanent cookies.

Functional cookies

These cookies allow memorizing the choices made by the user in order to optimize functionality. For example, functional cookies allow us to remember a user's specific settings, such as country selection and, if set, permanent login status.

Other types of cookies:

Profiling cookies are not used.

Third-party services are not used to process user's data.

There are not interactions with social networks and external platforms
